- Over the past three years, the Didactic Program in Dietetics has had 51 students take the RD exam with 47 passing within the first year of taking the exam. (92.16% pass rate)
- Over the past five years, the Dietetic Intern Program has had 50 take the RD exam with 47 passing on the first attempt. (94.0% first time pass rate)
- Over the past five years, Family and Consumer Science Teacher Education candidates that have sat for the Assessment of Professional Teaching (APT) test have passed with a 100% pass rate.
- The department has an overall pass rate of 95.4% on licensing exams.
